Description: This course is designed to inform First Receivers about the unique and challenging requirements of administering point of wounding medical care administered by Law Enforcement or Fire/Rescue/EMS personnel to patients during high-threat incidents.

This course will both teach First Receivers what they need to know to react to and prepare for an attack, but also how to effectively continue care from the point of wounding to trauma resuscitation. First Receivers will understand how and why first responders assist wounded, and in what condition casualties will be in when they arrive at the hospital or trauma center.
