Description: This course is designed to teach law enforcement personnel about the differences between responding to and dealing with an isolated incident versus a high-threat situation with mass casualties. It will also teach and reinforce basic life-saving TECC skills for law enforcement personnel that may be applied in “officer down” self-help/buddy-aid situations, as well as provision of point of wounding care during other high-threat incidents.
